



I heard the bells on Christmas Day

And thought how, as the day had come, The belfries of all Christendom Had rolled along, the unbroken song Of peace on earth, good-will to men!




Till, ringing, singing on its way,

* As of July 30.



Psalm 37:7-10

Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him; fret not yourself over the one who prospers in his way, over the man who carries out evil devices! Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil. For the evildoers shall be cut off, but those who wait for the Lord shall inherit the land. In just a little while, the wicked will be no more; though you look carefully at his place, he will not be there.

They will soon fade like the grass and wither (v.2) Evildoers shall be cut off (v.9) 3. The wicked will be no more (v.10) Their sword shall enter their own heart (v.15) 5. 



3. Be bothered by evil.

...and if [God] rescued righteous Lot, greatly distressed by the sensual conduct of the wicked (for as that righteous man lived among them day after day, he was tormenting his righteous soul over their lawless deeds that he saw and heard)

4. Be grieved by evil.

Ezekiel 9:4

And the Lord said to [Ezekiel], "Pass through the city, through Jerusalem, and put a mark on the foreheads of the men who sigh and groan over all the abominations that are committed in it."

5. Be <u>angered</u> by evil.

Romans 1:18

For the <u>wrath</u> of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

6. Be fearless of evil.

Psalm 23:4

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me;

7. Laugh at evil.

Psalm 2:1-4

Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against his Anointed, saying, "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us." 8. Expose evil.


Ephesians 5:11

9. Avoid dwelling on evil.

Philippians 4:8

Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things.



10. Overcome evil with good.

Matthew 5:38-41

You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles

11. Be forgiving of great evil.

1 Corinthians 6:9-11

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

12. <u>Pray</u> against evil.


Matthew 6:9, 13 Pray then like this:
