


#### John 18:38–40 | The Substitutionary King

#### John 19:6-11 | The King over Death

... When Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid. He entered his headquarters again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me?...
