- A picture of God's supreme love for each and every one of us.








But God demonstrates his own <u>love</u> toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.








Greater <u>love</u> has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends.






- 6. Claiming to be Christ, a King. (Luke 23:2)

- Latin was the language of <u>law</u>.






Psalm 22:18

I gave my back to those who strike, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not my face from disgrace and spitting.












- Mary, the mother of Jesus
