

#### **Righteous Anger?**

- 1. Jesus got angry (Matthew 21:12-13).
- 2. James 1:19 specifically says to be *slow* to anger.
- 3. Ephesians 4:26 says to "be angry and do not sin."

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<u>James 1:20</u> ...for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God.

<u>Ephesians 4:26-27</u> Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and give no opportunity to the devil.



#### <u>Ephesians 4:31</u> Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander <u>be put away</u> from you, along with all malice.

<u>Colossians 3:8</u> But now you must <u>put them all away</u>: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.



<u>Galatians 5:19-21</u> Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, <u>fits of anger</u>, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.



## <u>James 1:20</u> ...for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God.



But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.



For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and <u>discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart</u>.

# **Bridling the Tongue**

<u>Proverbs 13:3</u> Whoever guards his mouth preserves his life; he who opens wide his lips comes to ruin.

<u>Proverbs 17:27</u> Whoever restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding.

<u>Proverbs 21:23</u> Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble.
