

Exodus 15:22-24

Then Moses made Israel set out from the Red Sea, and they went into the wilderness of Shur. They went three days in the wilderness and found no water. 2-3 million people needed 2,000 tons - or four million pounds - of food each day.

To bring that much food each day, would require...



3 freight trains, each a mile long!





In the desert they needed firewood to cook and keep warm.

Each day this would take 4,000 tons - or eight million pounds - of wood, and...



... a few more freight trains, each a mile long.





And they needed water.

If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, it would take 11 million gallons each day, and...



...a freight train with tank cars 1,800 miles long, just to bring water!





And each time they camped, they needed a campground two-thirds the size of the State of Rhode Island, <u>about 750 square miles</u>.







Numbers 11:1-6


