




Wandering through life's wildernesses, we're susceptible to quit trusting God regarding our needs and sins.


The good news of the Smitten Rock provides wilderness-endurance through a renewed view of God's character.
















Exodus 17:2-3


Exodus 17:7

And he called the name of the place...Meribah, because of the quarreling of the people of Israel, and because they tested the LORD by saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"
















Complaint Episodes in Numbers

Complaint against Moses (12:1-16): by siblings


Complaint/failure to enter Promiseland (13 & 14)

God's instruction to Moses

Numbers 20:8

"Take the staff, and assemble the congregation, you and Aaron your brother, and tell the rock before their eyes to yield its water. So you shall bring water out of the rock for them and give drink to the congregation."



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Numbers 20:9-11

And Moses took the staff from before the LORD, as he commanded him.



Numbers 20:9-11

Then Moses and Aaron gathered the assembly together before the rock, and he said to them, "Hear now, you rebels: shall we bring water for you out of this rock?" And Moses lifted up his hand and struck the rock with his staff twice, and water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank...

What was Moses' sin?

Numbers 20:12

"... you did not believe in me..."

Numbers 27:14

"...you rebelled against my word in the wilderness of Zin when the congregation quarreled, <u>failing to uphold me as holy</u>...."



What was Moses' sin?

Psalm 106:32-33

They angered [Moses] at the waters of Meribah,

and it went ill with Moses on their account,

for they made his spirit bitter,

and he spoke rashly with his lips.



What was Moses' sin?

1. Disbelieved the LORD

that speaking to the Rock would provide water.

2. Rebelled against His word

• Instead of speaking to, he stuck the rock. Twice.

3. Spoke rash words

 Harsh + Self-focused words: (Rebels...shall we bring water out)



At Meribah God showed Himself holy

Numbers 20:12-13

And the LORD said "Because you did not ...uphold me as **holy** in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them." These are the waters of Meribah, where the people of Israel quarreled with the LORD, and through them he showed himself holy.

Foreshadowing His punishment in our place

Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows;

Clarifying a sufficient one-time sacrifice

For Christ has entered...into heaven itself [not to] offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the holy places every year with blood not his own, for then he would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. (Hebrews 9:24-26)

Clarifying means of ongoing forgiveness
