


The Lamp




A lamp once hung in an ancient town

The lamp was plain, and rough, and old


As it weathered the storm alone;

The Lamp




That lamp is the frame of a human heart Who seeks, though it's worn and tried, To shine for God, and to show the Road To souls who have gone aside!

inside.



Loneliness



Nearly half (47%) of Americans report feeling lonely at times. (Cigna Study)

79% of Generation Z (ages 18-22) report feelings of loneliness. (Cigna Study)

71% of Millennials (ages 23-37) report high levels of loneliness. (YouGov. Survey)

Loneliness Stats

Adults of age 65+ are particularly vulnerable to chronic loneliness due to factors such as retirement, loss of social connections, and mobility limitations.

Women are more likely to report feeling lonely than men, with 72% of women saying they feel lonely at times, compared to 60% of men. (YouGov.)

Only 38% of men report that they would talk to someone if they felt lonely, versus to 56% of women.

Types of Loneliness

- Emotional loneliness the absence of meaningful relationships
- 2. <u>Social loneliness</u> a perceived deficit in the quality of social connections
- 3. Existential loneliness a feeling of fundamental separateness from others and the wider world
