
Exodus 35:2



















Galatians 3:15-18

To give a human example, brothers: even with a manmade covenant, no one annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified. Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, "And to offsprings," referring to many, but referring to one, "And to your offspring," who is Christ. This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void. For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.

Galatians 3:16

Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his <u>offspring</u>. It does not say, "And to offsprings," referring to many, but referring to one, "And to your <u>offspring</u>," who is Christ.



Genesis 22:15-18

And the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

The timeline of the Covenants as explained in Galatians 3



The covenant promise made in Eden, repeated to Abraham The Old Covenant made with physical Israel. Israel under the schoolmaster Christ crucified. The New Covenant made with spiritual Israel. Israel no longer under the law

Galatians 3:19-26

Why then the law? <u>It was added because of</u> <u>transgressions</u>, until the offspring should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary. Now an intermediary implies more than one, but God is one.



Galatians 3:19-26

Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law. But <u>the Scripture imprisoned</u> <u>everything under sin</u>, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.



Galatians 3:19-26

Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. So then, <u>the law was our</u> <u>guardian</u> until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.




3 Purposes of the Law

- 1. It was added because of transgressions (v. 19)
- 2. [It] imprisoned everything under sin (v. 22)
- 3. Before faith came, we were held captive under the law (v. 23)



"After God gave the promise to Abraham, He gave the law to Moses. Why? He had to make things worse before He could make them better. The law exposed sin, provoked sin, condemned sin.

The purpose of the law was to lift the lid off man's respectability and disclose what he really is underneath—sinful, rebellious, guilty, under the punishment of God and helpless to save himself. And the law must still be allowed to do its God-given duty today.



One of the greatest faults of the contemporary church is the tendency to soft-pedal sin and judgment. We must never bypass the law and come straight to the gospel. To do so is to contradict the plan of God in biblical history.

Not until the law has condemned and killed us will we call upon Christ for justification and life.


Not until the law has driven us to despair of ourselves will we ever believe in Jesus.



You see, at the center of all religions is the idea of Karma.



Love interrupts, if you like, the consequences of your actions, which in my case is very good news indeed, because I've done a lot of stupid stuff."


