# What was driving these false teachers to circumcise new converts?

# Why the cross of Christ precludes any occasion for our boasting:

1. Boasting is excluded by faith.

(Romans 3:27) Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? <u>No, but by</u> <u>the law of faith</u>.



# Why the cross of Christ precludes any occasion for our boasting:

2. Boasting is excluded by the kind of people God chose to save.

#### (1 Corinthians 1:27-29)

But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, <u>so that no human</u> <u>being might boast in the presence of God</u>.

## 2 Deaths; 2 Resurrections

The <u>first death</u> is spiritual. We are born spiritually dead with a sinful nature, separated from a relationship with God.

The <u>second death</u> is described in the book of Revelation, when all spiritually dead people are judged and cast into the lake of fire (hell).



## 2 Deaths; 2 Resurrections

The <u>first resurrection</u> is spiritual. It's when a person comes to a saving knowledge of Christ and is born again.

The <u>second resurrection</u> is in the future, when all who have been born again are physically raised to new life with glorified incorruptible bodies.
