

Pure in Heart

Primary aim is to seek & know God



1 Timothy 1:3-7

As I urged you when I was going to Macedonia, remain at Ephesus so that you may charge certain persons not to teach any different doctrine, nor to devote themselves to myths and endless genealogies, which promote speculations rather than the stewardship from God that is by faith. The aim of our charge is love that issues from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith. Certain persons, by swerving from these, have wandered away into vain discussion, desiring to be teachers of the law, without understanding either what they are saying or the things about which they make confident assertions.



Pure in Heart

- Primary aim is to seek & know God
- Consistent in character
 - Cognitive Dissonance: Knowing what is right but preferring something different
 - Hypocrisy: Demanding adherence to a standard that we don't keep
 - Idolatry is often the root of inconsistent character.






Matthew 5:9

Blessed are the Peacemakers

- Peacemakers ≠ Peacekeepers
- God, through Jesus, is the ultimate peacemaker.



God is the Ultimate Peacemaker

Colossians 1:19-20: For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.



Blessed are the Peacemakers

- Peacemakers ≠ Peacekeepers

- Peacemaking isn't "truth bombing" or mocking people into conformity.

Acts 7:54-57

Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him. But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. And he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together at him.





Hebrews 11:32-38a

And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets— who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received back their dead by resurrection.



Hebrews 11:32-38a (cont.)

Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword. They went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, mistreated— of whom the world was not worthy...
