Matthew 7:1-6



John 3:19-20

And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed.

Matthew 7:1-6 (page 812)

Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye. "Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them underfoot and turn to attack you."

1 Corinthians 2:15

The spiritual person judges (*i.e.* examines, appraises, or discerns) <u>all things</u>, but is himself to be judged by no one.





1 Corinthians 4:3-5

But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. For I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me.

Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God.



Hebrews 11:7

By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. <u>By this he</u> <u>condemned the world</u> and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.





Ephesians 5:11

Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead <u>expose them</u>.





Luke 17:3

Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, <u>rebuke him</u>, and if he repents, forgive him,

If on the Sabbath a man receives circumcision, so that the law of Moses may not be broken, are you angry with me because on the Sabbath I made a man's whole body well? Do not judge by appearances, but judge with right judgment."

Romans 2:1-3

Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things.

We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God?



James 4:11-12

Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law. But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. <u>There is only one lawgiver and judge</u>, he who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?



The Jewish Talmud

(b Shabbath 127b, M Sotah 1:7, b Baba Metzia 59b)

"Do not assume the place of God by deciding you have the right to stand in judgment over all—do not do it, I say, in order to avoid being called to account by the God whose place you usurp."





But when the archangel Michael, contending with the devil, was disputing about the body of Moses, <u>he did</u> not presume to pronounce a blasphemous judgment, (that is, a slanderous, abusive, or vilifying judgment), but said, "The Lord rebuke you."





John 12:47

If anyone hears my words and does not keep them, <u>I do not judge him</u>; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world.





1 Corinthians 5:12-13

For what have I to do with judging outsiders? <u>Is it</u> not those inside the church whom you are to judge? God judges those outside. "Purge the evil person from among you."



R.C. Sproul

Beloved, we fail to really understand the sinfulness of sin. If God the Holy Spirit were to convict you right now of the full measure of your sin, you wouldn't be able to stand it. If the Spirit revealed to me right now the full measure of my sin, I would probably run from this pulpit screaming in anguish!





R.C. Sproul

The conviction of sin laid upon us by the Spirit of truth is often powerful, yet gentle and sweet.

Even when He convicts us of our guilt, He leads us not to despair, but to the Savior and His forgivness that gives us freedom.

Summary
