Jesus' warnings of hell

Wide gate/easy way:

• leads to destruction (vs 13-14)

False prophets=fruitless/diseased tree:

cut down and thrown into the fire (vs 15-20)



Jesus' warnings of hell

Those attempting heaven-entrance by human performance:

- not granted entrance to kingdom of heaven
- instead told <u>'I never knew you; depart from</u> me, you workers of lawlessness.' (vs 21-23)

"I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God. That is the one thing we must not say..."

Non-ignorable words of King Jesus

- "Let your light shine before others." ~Jesus
- "Everyone who is angry…will be liable to the hell of fire." ~Jesus
- "Everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart." ~Jesus
- "Love your enemies." ~Jesus



Non-ignorable words of King Jesus

- "When you give to the needy...when you pray." ~Jesus
- "You cannot serve God and money." ~Jesus
- "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness."
 - ~Jesus
- "Take the log out of your own eye." ~Jesus
- "Enter by the narrow gate." ~Jesus
