Matthew 7:21-23 (page 812)

Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'

Romans 10:8-9

But what does it [*i.e.* the righteousness based on faith] say?

"The word is near you, in your <u>mouth</u> and in your <u>heart</u>" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your <u>mouth</u> that Jesus is Lord and believe in your <u>heart</u> that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.



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3. It's proof that God is going to judge the world through Jesus (Acts 17:31).

4. It's proof that since God raised Jesus from the dead, his promise to raise us as well, is trustworthy.

Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to clothe herself with **fine linen, bright and pure**"—for the fine linen is the **righteous deeds** of the saints.
