Philippians 1:22-24 If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account.

The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

The Christian and The Flesh

- 1. We have been transformed, especially in that the Holy Spirit now dwells within us.
- 2. Due to the Holy Spirit's presence, we have a new set of inclinations and longings for God the Father.
- 3. Yet the flesh is still a real and present enemy.
- 4. Therefore, we are engaged in an ongoing battle with the flesh, but we have the resources to overcome it.
