Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak like that? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"

"By faith, I fully accept the forgiveness that God, the only Judge, has given me, regardless of my feelings. I choose to place the authority of his Word above the authority of my feelings."

Take-Aways:

- 1. The greatest words you will ever hear from God are, "Son, your sins are forgiven."
- 2. Jesus always has time for you. You are *never* an interruption.
- 3. Seek to value God's spiritual blessings above his physical blessings.
- 4. Exercise bold, audacious faith in your prayers and actions. Believe God for the impossible.

Take-Aways:

- 5. Your circle of friends matters. Run with others who have audacious faith.
- 6. Like the man's four friends, be willing to go to extreme lengths to bring others to Jesus.
- 7. Freely receive God's forgiveness by faith, regardless of your feelings.

To Forgive Requires:

- 1. A fear of the Lord regarding his command to forgive
- 2. A <u>willingness</u> to absorb the very real cost of an offense
- 3. A <u>faith</u> that God allowed the offense, and that he can use it for my good
- 4. A <u>satisfaction</u> that perfect justice will be had, either at the cross, or in hell
- 5. A <u>deep understanding</u> of the gospel itself, and how much God has forgiven me
