
"The question is not merely whether we can rest in our faith, but whether we can rest in the doubt that is the necessary alternative of faith.

We pass sometimes through periods of very low spiritual vitality. The wonderful gospel which formerly seemed to be so glorious, comes to seem almost like an idle tale.


Hosts of objections arise in our minds; the whole unseen world recedes in the dim distance, and we think for the moment, that we have relinquished the Christian hope."

The Great Irony

They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?"


