On this depends our present comforts and future blessedness. This is the life and reward of our souls."



"Make no mistake," He says, "if you let me, I will make you perfect. The moment you put yourself in My hands, that is what you are in for. Nothing less, or other, than that.


You have free will, and if you choose, you can push Me away. But if you do not push Me away, understand that I am going to see this job through.





But when our words reflect Christ's heart in what we say and don't say, people can't help but notice:


